Biography of Bernard M. Baruch

Bernard M. Baruch, a financier and public adviser, was a millionaire by the age of thirty thanks to his investments in the stock market. He put his wealth to use in politics and public affairs and became an adviser to Woodrow Wilson, who appointed him chairman of the War Industries Board and a member of the president's war council. After World War I, he took part in the postwar peace conference and later became an adviser to President Roosevelt on defense matters and industrial preparedness for war. After World War II, President Truman appointed him ambassador to the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission.

Description

This collection consists primarily of public papers relating to Baruch's various involvements in government affairs. It includes several runs of office correspondence as well as a small amount of personal correspondence. Among the Political Activities documented in this collection are his involvement in the War Industries Board, the American Commission to Negotiate Peace, the Council of National Defense, the National Industrial Conference, the Saratoga Springs Commission, the Rubber Survey Committee, the War and Post-War Adjustment Unit of the U.S. Office of War Mobilization, the mission to England for President Roosevelt, and his service as the United States representative to the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission. The collection also contains published and unpublished writings, including diaries, book drafts, articles, and statements written by Baruch and secondary material about Baruch or pertaining to his interests. The papers also include a large number of photographs of Baruch and his friends and family members, as well as a collection of political cartoons, drawings, and caricatures of Baruch.

Other material included in the collection includes diplomas and tokens of honor as well as miscellaneous genealogical and office records.

The selected correspondence files contain correspondence filed separately by Baruch for its special significance. The personal correspondence files include notes and letters of a personal nature, some of which are mounted in a scrapbook. Routine office correspondence constitutes the general correspondence files. The telephone messages contain daily records made by Baruch's office of calls received; they indicate instances in which Baruch handled the matter personally.

Series Description

This series contains records pertaining to Baruch's involvement in politics, 1917-1945. Among the activities documented in this series are Baruch's activities as the leader of the War Industries Board, a government agency that coordinated the purchase of war supplies during World War I, 1917-1918; his service as a member of the American Commission to Negotiate Peace, a commission appointed by President Woodrow Wilson to negotiate formal treaties following World War I, January 1, 1918-December 9, 1919; his involvement with President Woodrow Wilson's Council of National Defense, an organization formed to coordinate national resources during wartime, 1917-1919; his service as as chairman of the Public Group at the National Industrial Conference in October 1919, a conference convened by President Woodrow Wilson to address industry and labor issues; involvement in the Saratoga Springs Commission, 1929-1930, a commission appointed by Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt to develop the mineral springs in Saratoga Springs, NY and establish a Mineral Springs Authority in New York; his activities as the head of the Rubber Survey Committee, an advisory body appointed by President Roosevelt to investigate the natural rubber supply, reuse of old tires, and manufacture of synthetic rubber, 1942-1945; his service as a member of the War and Post-War Adjustment Unit of the U.S. Office of War Mobilization and as an advisor to its director, James F. Byrnes, 1943-1944; his mission to England for President Roosevelt in 1945 which was interrupted by the President's

death; and his service as the United States representative to the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission, 1946, a commission founded by the first resolution of the U.N. General Assembly to make recommendations on the peaceful use of atomic energy.
